The Renewable Resource Extension Act's investment in Idaho's landowners and natural resource professionals has been multiplied threefold by partnering state, private, and institutional organizations and agencies. Our annual RREA grant of \$53,952 leverages approximately \$150,000 in partner grants and indirect contributions.

In Idaho, RREA funds were used to:

- Leverage direct grant dollars from local, state, and regional agencies and organizations totaling \$98,500 allowing us to:
 - offer low-cost workshops covering a wide range of natural resource topics;
 - enhance Master Gardener training;
 - support the UI Extension Forestry and Natural Resources outreach web site, and;
 - work with local tribal forestry and county governments to enhance knowledge of forest fuel hazard management treatments and maintenance.
